
Integrated Regional Water Management Terms

- Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM):
 Collaborative effort to manage all aspects of water resources in a region. Administered by DWR and SWRCB through bond-funded Grant Programs
- **Funding Area:** Funds are allocated to the 12 hydrologic region-based Funding Areas.
- Regional Water Management Group (RWMG): Formed by groups of regional water managers, and are the governing body of IRWM regions.
- **IRWM Region:** Accepted into the IRWM Grant Program through the Region Acceptance Process.
- **IRWM Plan:** A comprehensive planning document for the IRWM Region. The process of creating an IRWM Plan is locally-driven and includes input from many diverse stakeholders. Must be consistent with DWR 2016 Plan Standards and the IRWM Planning Act (SB1672).



Integrated Regional Water Management Funding

- Proposition 1 (2014): Authorized \$510 million in Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) funding.
 - \$22.5 million for Colorado River Funding Area.
- **Planning Grant:** For IRWM regions to develop or update an IRWM plan to meet the 2016 IRWM Plan Standards.
 - \$1 Million Planning Grant Awarded to San Gorgonio IRWM Region.
- Implementation Grant: Funding for projects that are ready or nearly ready to proceed to implementation, consistent with an adopted IRWM Plan.
 - Anticipated in Early 2018




San Gorgonio IRWM Region

- Mojave






San Gorgonio IRWM Region

- Excludes Mojave Desert Watersheds to the North










IRWM Regional Governance

- Seeks to achieve consensus on IRWM Program goals and activities with input from SAC and public






Stakeholder Advisory Committee Role and Function


- Provide recommendations to RWMG
